# Christmas is a contradiction

- Most significant event in the history of mankind since creation, yet it is only celebrated annually like another religious event.
- Even for Christians, it is often celebrated culturally without its true significance.

# The Word (John 1)

- 1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was with God in the beginning. 3 Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. 4 In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind.
- 14 The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

# The Word

- In the beginning was the Word(1)
- He was(2), in Him, through Him and without Him(3)  
....pronoun of a Person
- **Eternal**...had no beginning
- **A Person**...a distinct personal being.

# Creator and giver of life

- Through Him all things were made(v3)
- the agent of every creative act of the Father.
- In Him was life(v4)
- Giver of life...origin and continuance of life.

- And that life was the light of men(4)
- Each person's life is an evidence of God in this world

# Word incarnate

- Word became flesh...seen the glory of the one and only Son(v14)
- The baby in the manger at Bethlehem was none other than the eternal Word....the Son of God



# INCARNATE

*the Word became flesh and dwelt among us*

- Latin word 'carnis'...flesh
- God became man in Jesus Christ

# The baby born...

- Real human baby



# The baby born...

Fully God:

- He had not ceased to be God, was no less God then than before, but He had begun to be man
- He was not now God minus some element of deity, but God plus all that He made as man

# Fully a man


- The Creator was now learning/ experiencing what it meant to be man.
- he was tempted by the devil (could not avoid it)
- the perfection of his human life was only achieved by his conflict with the devil like us.

# Hebrews 2: 17-18

- <sup>17</sup> For this reason he had to be made like them, fully human in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people. <sup>18</sup> Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted.

# Reason... made fully human

- Make atonement for sins
- Only a sinless man could die to pay the penalty of sin.
- Can the death of one man atone for the sins of many?

- through Jesus Christ is atonement for sin


# But it meant...

Human limitations:


- He walked...was tired, thirsty and hungry
- He was sad...cried
- He slept.
- He also suffered disappointment, denial and betrayal
- He died a cruel and painful death

**For we do not have  
a high priest who is  
unable to empathize with  
our weaknesses, but we have  
one who has been tempted  
in every way, just as we are  
-yet He did not sin.-**




# John Piper

- You would think that if God so rule the world as to use an empire-wide census to bring Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem, he surely could have seen to it that a room was available in the inn.
- Yes, he could. He absolutely could have! And Jesus could have been born into a wealthy family ( or even of royalty)
- The question is not what God could do, but what he willed to do

# God's purpose..

- That the birth at Bethlehem...
- Ended at the cross of Calvary.
- According to His Father's will, our Lord Jesus Christ was born into poverty, in a smelly stable, so that

# Mary's surrender

- <sup>30</sup> But the angel said to her, “Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. <sup>31</sup> You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus <sup>34</sup> “How will this be,” Mary asked the angel, “since I am a virgin?” ( Luke 1)

# Surrender to God's will

- Mary was worried at the task ahead but she surrendered to the word of the Lord for her

**B**  
“I am the Lord’s servant,”  
Mary answered. “May your  
word to me be fulfilled.”  
Then the angel left her.

Luke 1:38 NIV

*“Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit; she will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.” (Matthew 1:20-21)*




# Obedience

- Planned to divorce Mary quietly.
- Joseph agreed to take Mary, who was with child, as his wife

# Simeon's longing

- <sup>25</sup> Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him.  
<sup>27</sup> Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, (Luke 2)

- Our Lord Jesus Christ brought the Kingdom of Heaven to earth...will return to bring its completion
- Phil 3:20 : But our citizenship is in heaven. And we await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ

# Anna

- <sup>36</sup>There was also a prophet, Anna, the daughter of Penuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was very old... <sup>37</sup> and then was a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshiped night and day, fasting and praying. <sup>38</sup>Coming up to them at that very moment, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem. (Luke 2:36-38)

# Christmas reflection
