

Luke 19:1-10

- 1 Jesus entered Jericho and was passing through.
- 2 A man was there by the name of Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector and was wealthy.
- 3 He wanted to see who Jesus was, but because *he was short* he could not see over the crowd.



- 4 So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-fig tree to see him, since Jesus was coming that way.
- 5 When Jesus reached the spot, he looked up and said to him, 'Zacchaeus, come down immediately. I must stay at your house today.'

- 6 So he came down at once and welcomed him gladly.
- 7 All the people saw this and began to mutter, 'He has gone to be the guest of a sinner.'



- 8 But Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord, 'Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount.'
- 9 Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man, too, is a son of Abraham.
- 10 For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.'




