Luke 1:46-50 (NIV)

46 And Mary said:

"My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant.

From now on all generations will call me blessed,

for the Mighty One has done great things for me—

holy is his name.

His mercy extends to those who fear him, from generation to generation.



Luke 1:51–56 (NIV)

- 51 He has performed mighty deeds with his arm; he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts.
- 52 He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble.
- 53 He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty.
- 54 He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful to Abraham and his descendants forever,

just as he promised our ancestors."





Mary's Magnificat

Biblical References on Mary

- The wife of Joseph, the mother of Jesus (Matt. 2:11; Acts 1:14)
- Little is known of her personal history
- Her genealogy is given in Luke 3.
 She was of the tribe of Judah and the lineage of David (Ps. 132:11; Luke 1:32)



Biblical References on Mary

- She was connected by marriage with Elisabeth, who was of the lineage of Aaron (Luke 1:36)
- While she resided at Nazareth with her parents, before she became the wife of Joseph, the angel Gabriel announced to her that she was to be the mother of the promised Messiah (Luke 1:35)
- She was a virgin when she conceived (Luke 1:34)



Social Implications for Mary

- Joseph may break their betrothal
- She will be the centre of gossip and humiliation in her family and her community.
 The Eastern culture is the culture of shame
- She will be unmarriageable



Biblical References on Mary

- After this she went to visit her cousin Elisabeth, who was living with her husband Zachariah
- Immediately on entering the house she was saluted by Elisabeth as the mother of her Lord, and then forthwith gave utterance to her hymn of thanksgiving (Luke 1:46–56; 1 Sam. 2:1–10)


the announcement of the Incarnation by the angel Gabriel to Mary (Luke 1:26–38)

3. Looks forward

Luke 1:51-53 (NIV)

51 He has performed mighty deeds with his arm; he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts.

52 He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble.

53 He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty.



Mary looks forward to God transforming the world through the Messiah. The proud will be brought low, and the humble will be lifted up; the hungry will be fed, and the rich will go without (Luke 1:51-53)

4. Exalts

Luke 1:54-55 (NIV)

54 He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful

55 to Abraham and his descendants forever, just as he promised our ancestors."



Mary exalts God because He has been faithful to His promise to Abraham (Luke 1:54-55; see God's promise to Abraham in Gen 12:1-3)

- 1. Mary **rejoices** that she has the privilege of giving birth to the promised Messiah (Luke 1:46–48).
- 2. She **glorifies** God for His power, holiness, and mercy (Luke 1:49–50).
- 3. Mary **looks forward** to God transforming the world through the Messiah. The proud will be brought low, and the humble will be lifted up; the hungry will be fed, and the rich will go without (Luke 1:51–53).
- 4. Mary **exalts God** because He has been faithful to His promise to Abraham (Luke 1:54–55; see God's promise to Abraham in Gen 12:1-3)




