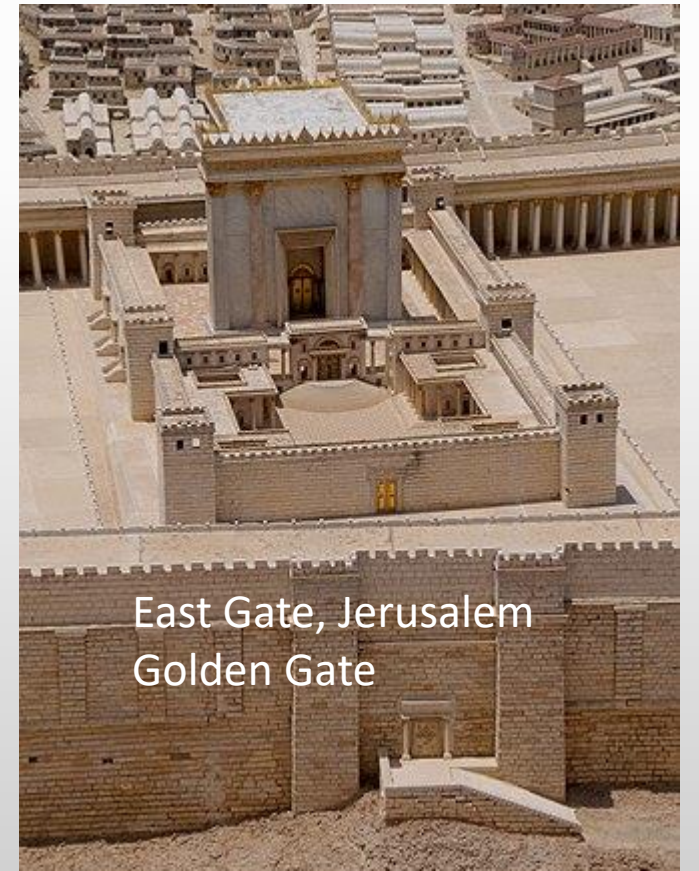

- Luke 19:41 (NIV)

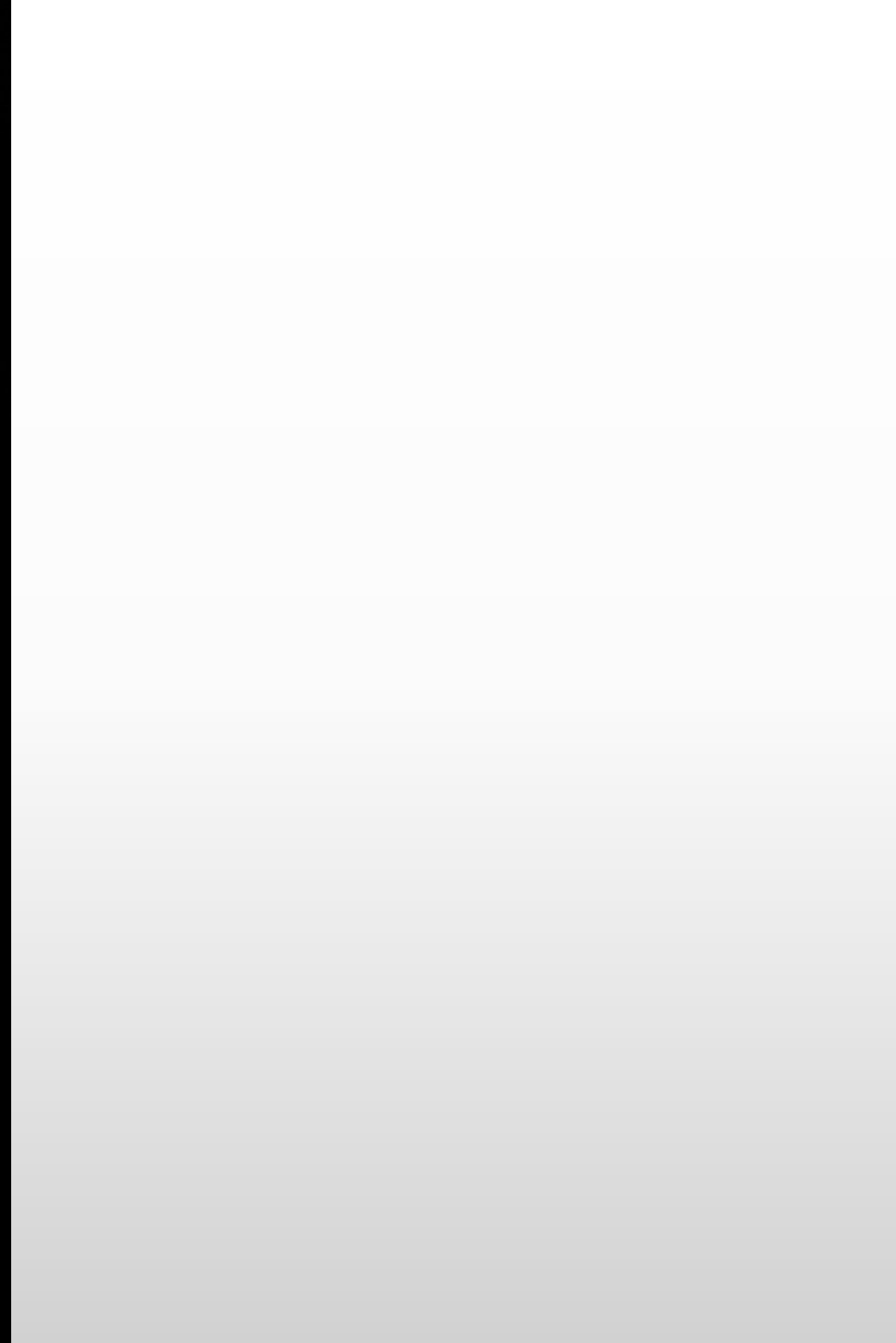
<sup>41</sup> As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it (*Flevit super illam* Latin)

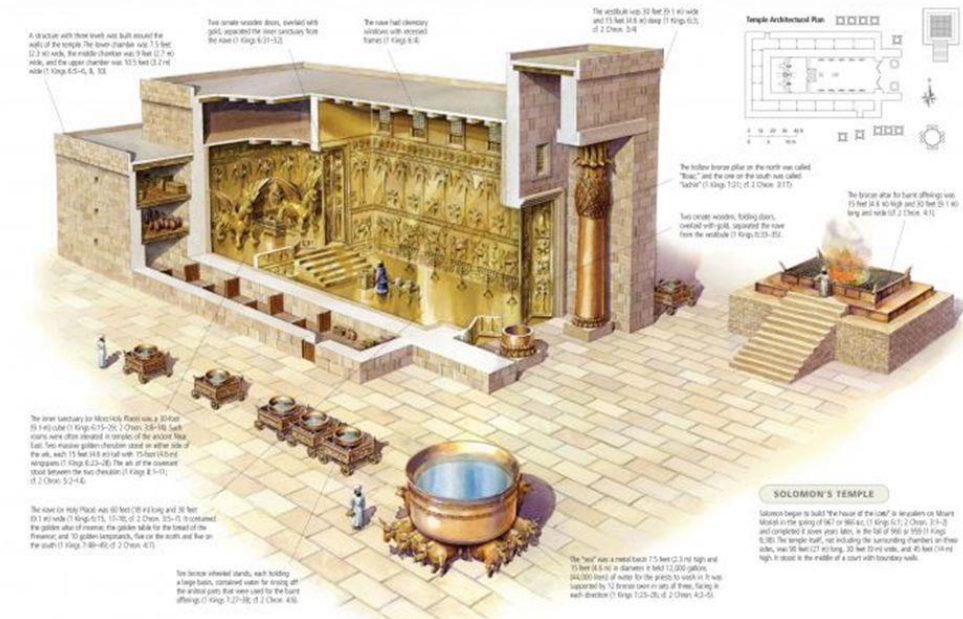

# 3. The Coming of the Saviour
