

#### Peter's question was answered

### It's the season of the grapes harvest

For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire workers for his vineyard.<sup>2</sup> He agreed to pay them a denarius for the day and sent them into his vineyard.

#### The landowner hired workers at 6am

# More Workers recruited at 9am, 12pm, 3pm, 5pm

About nine in the morning he went out...
He told them, "You also go and work in my vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right."... 'He went out again about noon and about three... About five in the afternoon...

#### He was a kind man!

He asked them, "Why have you been standing here all day long doing nothing?" "Because no one has hired us," they answered. 'He said to them, "You also go and work in my vineyard."



### **Paying time**

'When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, beginning with the last ones hired...each received a denarius."

#### What a Generous Boss!

The workers who were hired last at 5pm were paid first and each received a denarius!



#### The Greatest Surprise

<sup>10</sup> So when those came who were hired first, they expected to receive more. But each one of them also received a denarius.

#### All were pay equally! One Denarius



# The 'unequal pay' Gross Injustice

When they received it, they began to grumble against the landowner. 12 "These who were hired last worked only one hour," they said, "and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the work and the heat of the day."

From 'Kind & Generous Boss' to 'It's NOT Fair!'








I'm More Than Fair! You are paid what you have agreed & expected




#### It's a great privilege to serve Him!


