



Matthew 11:1-24 John the Baptist The Doubting Prophet

After Jesus had finished instructing his twelve disciples, he went on from there to teach and preach in the towns of Galilee. ² When John, who was in prison, heard about the deeds of the Messiah, he sent his disciples ³ to ask him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or should we expect someone else?'


Is Jesus the Christ?

Doubt and Unbelief

It draws us near to God, receive His assurance and increase our faith in Him.




He looked to Jesus for answer

⁴ Jesus replied, 'Go back and report to John what you hear and see: ⁵ the blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the good news is proclaimed to the poor.

Jesus directed him to the word of God with tact and tenderness Exhorted Him to Persevere

⁶ Blessed is anyone who does not stumble on account of me.'



Commended His Boldness and Courage

'What did you go out into the wilderness to see?

A reed swayed by the wind? 8 If not, what did you go out to see? A man dressed in fine clothes? No, those who wear fine clothes are in kings' palaces.

¹⁷ "We played the pipe for you, and you did not dance; we sang a dirge, and you did not mourn."


Stubborn Prideful Hearts!

A Grave Warning: Woe on Unrepentant Towns

21 'Woe to you, <u>Chorazin!</u> Woe to you, <u>Bethsaida!</u> For if the miracles that were performed in you had been performed in <u>Tyre and Sidon</u>, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes. ²² But I tell you, it will be more bearable for Tyre and Sidon on the day of judgment than for you.



²³ And you, <u>Capernaum</u>, will you be lifted to the heavens? No, you will go down to Hades...²⁴ But I tell you that it will be more bearable for <u>Sodom</u> on the day of judgment than for you.'




Even as we doubt when people and things are against us
